

Smishing Attacks on the Rise

According to noted cyber-security expert Stu Sjouwerman from KnowBe4, Smishing (attacks on smartphones) is increasing as internet criminals try to circumvent email spam filters and other security measures.

Remember to be as diligent with your smartphone as you are with your email cyber-security knowledge. The "bad guys" are increasingly targeting through your smartphone. They send texts that trick you into doing something against your own best interest. At the moment, there is a mystery shopping scam going on, starting out with a text invitation, asking you to send an email for more information, which gets you roped into the scam.

Always, when you get a text, remember, "Think Before You Tap," because more and more, texts are used for identity theft, bank account takeovers, and to pressure you into giving out personal or company confidential information.
